Students learn the history and purpose of ERP, the UX-One user interface for JD Edwards, and follow the normal training “company” to experience and practice typical ERP functions using EnterpriseOne. They finish with operational reporting, an overview of segregation of duties, and a glimpse into how ERP supports “digital transformation.”
